TEEX MGT-319, POINT OF DISPENSING, PLANNING AND RESPONSE

September 17-18, 2025

Kent County Health Department is hosting TEEX MGT-319, Point of Dispensing, Planning and Response. This course is a guide for local health officials and their partners to coordinate plans to provide mass distribution of medical countermeasures in response to a large-scale public health incident. This course focuses on planning considerations, recommendation to achieve the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC's) 48-hour standard for Mass Prophylaxis, and the local community's Mass Prophylaxis and Point of Dispensing (POD) site preparedness. The course material is applicable to pandemic influenza, bio-terrorism, and other public health emergencies.

HHS and DARPA Collaborate with Industry to Enhance Domestic Health Manufacturing Efforts

The industry partners selected to launch projects under this program include Battelle Memorial Institute and Aprexia; BrightPath Laboratories; Rutgers University; and the Mark Cuban Cost Plus Drug Company. Four innovative demonstration projects are now underway, leveraging artificial intelligence, machine learning, and informatics to make essential medicines onsite at the point of care using small manufacturing platforms, some no larger than a standard refrigerator, rather than full-size production facilities. All of the projects are expected to submit abbreviated new drug applications to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration within a year as a part of this government-supported development work.

L0449 INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM (ICS) CURRICULA TRAIN-THE-TRAINER IN PLAINFIELD, IN

Indiana is offering the L0449 Incident Command System (ICS) Curricula Train-the-Trainer course **July 21-25, 2025**, in Plainfield, IN. They currently have several seats available, and they want to extend an invitation to FEMA Region V partners to attend this course. Students would need to obtain a Public Safety Identification number (PSID) through Indiana to register on our state training system and registration with TEEEX would be required. All cost would be paid by the sending agency

Prerequisites for this course (Must be current as of 2019 or newer):

- IS 100, 200, 700, 800
- G-191
- ICS 300, 400
- Formal instructor training such National Wildland Coordinating Group Facilitative Instructor, EMI Master Trainer Program, Fire Instructor I&2, ASTD, CTTI, POST, FLETC, college, E0141, Instructional Presentation and Evaluation Skills, Office for Domestic Preparedness Instructor Course, valid teaching certificate, or equivalent.
 - If you can prove you teach a college class, that will work too

- Proof of Instructor Experience (ie. Letter listing your operational experience.)
 - You can use a letter signed by your leadership on letterhead with your experience

You will have to upload your prerequisites to both Indiana's and the TEEEX system.

- Step 3: Click "PSID Application"
- Step 4: Click "Apply for a PSID"
- Step 5: Provide necessary information and submit your application.
