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GETs/WPS Information

Sudden communication disruption resulting in network congestion or degradation can be the result of common incidents, such as weather-related events, cyber-attacks, and human errors. These communication disruptions can restrict response times and critical information sharing among essential personnel and organizations. This one-pager is designed to share information about Government Emergency Telecommunications Service (GETS) and Wireless Priority Services (WPS). These federal programs enhance communication during disasters by allowing certain users to have prioritized communication access via wireline commercial networks and some priority of cellular networks and wireless. 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FEMA UPDATES

2022 National Preparedness Report Released

FEMA released the [2022 National Preparedness Report](#), revealing the impacts that climate change and associated natural disasters continue to have on emergency management capabilities and communities across the country. The report identifies the challenges that emergency managers face in addressing a changing risk environment and how they can meet those challenges to help achieve a more prepared nation. Emergency managers and whole community partners across the nation can look to this year's report to help support decisions about program priorities, resource allocations, and community actions.

FEMA Develops and Delivers Training to Address Active Shooter Incidents

FEMA has developed several courses to help people and communities through training and education. Independent study courses [IS-904: Active Shooter Prevention: You Can Make a Difference](#) and [IS-905: Responding to an Active Shooter: You Can Make a Difference](#), are the first tier of a three-tier process that are part of FEMA's prevention and response efforts to active shooter incidents. IS-904 focuses on reducing the likelihood of active shooter incidents in the workplace, while IS-905 is about responding with resilience and flexibility. With sustained pediatric respiratory illnesses, including RSV, and flu the children's hospitals in Michigan, across the region and nation remain at capacity. PICUs are full and ED boarding is occurring for many admitted patients. There have been increased encounters with critical, respiratory pediatric patients and it is expected this will continue as flu is now on the rise in Michigan. Expanding Treatment Capacity in Michigan for Children and Youth with Mental Health Crisis

Please check out this article outlining some of the ways the State aims [to expand treatment capacity for children with mental health concerns](#), by offering a form of financial incentive — under a new, more formalized contract process — to dozens of residential treatment facilities that contract with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services.

- In broad strokes, MDHHS is offering these facilities a more generous and steady form of payment to keep more beds open and staffed for young people in crisis.
 - By agreeing to pay centers to maintain a maximum number of beds, these facilities can offer steadier job security to the aides, nurses and others who care for patients.
 - Steadying income for the facilities will help them maintain and train staff and provide better care for youth, whatever the bed occupancy.
 - The [Community Mental Health Association of Michigan](#) supports the state's move, said its executive director, Bob Sheehan.

From the National Pediatric Disaster Coalition

The American College of Surgeons has announced new pediatric verification standards for all trauma centers. The best way to prepare is to identify a team member who can serve in the role of a pediatric emergency care coordinator or PECC or Pediatric Champion. A PECC/Pediatric Champion can be any physician, nurse, or clinical team member; previous pediatric experience is not required.

Understanding National Operations Security

It's January and that means it's National Operations Security (OPSEC) awareness month. January was designated as National OPSEC awareness month by National Security Officials in recognition of National Security Presidential Memorandum 28, the National Operations Security Program, which updated the previous policy and outlined new requirements for all government departments and agencies. OPSEC is the systematic and proven process by which potential adversaries can be denied information about capabilities and intentions by identifying, controlling, and protecting generally unclassified evidence of the planning and execution of sensitive activities. Identifying key data, identifying the motives and goals of threat actors, and actively seeking out threat information can significantly decrease the collection of sensitive information. OPSEC is regularly practiced in the Healthcare and Public Health (HPH) Sector to protect patient information such as protected health information (PHI) and personally identifiable information (PII). CISA Orders Agencies to Patch Exchange Bug Used by Ransomware Gang

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) has added two more security vulnerabilities to its catalog of exploited bugs. The first is a Microsoft

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Exchange elevation of privileges bug tracked as [CVE-2022-41080](#) that can be chained with the CVE-2022-41082 ProxyNotShell bug to gain remote code execution. Texas-based cloud computing provider Rackspace [confirmed](#) one week ago that the Play ransomware gang exploited it as a zero-day to bypass Microsoft's [ProxyNotShell URL rewrite mitigations](#) and escalate permissions on compromised Exchange servers. The exploit used in the attack, dubbed [OWASSRF](#) by CrowdStrike security researchers who spotted it, was also [shared online](#) with some of Play ransomware's other malicious tools. This will likely make it easier for other cybercriminals to create their own custom exploits or adapt Play ransomware's tool for their own purposes, adding to the urgency of patching this vulnerability as soon as possible. Organizations with on-premises Microsoft Exchange servers are advised to deploy the latest Exchange security updates immediately (with November 2022 being the minimum patch level) or disable Outlook Web Access (OWA) until they can apply CVE-2022-41080 patches. The second vulnerability CISA added to its Known Exploited Vulnerabilities (KEV) catalog is a privilege escalation zero-day ([CVE-2023-21674](#)) in the Windows Advanced Local Procedure Call (ALPC), tagged as being exploited in attacks and patched by Microsoft during [this month's Patch Tuesday](#). Microsoft Releases January 2023 Security Updates

Microsoft has released updates to address multiple vulnerabilities in Microsoft software. An attacker could exploit some of these vulnerabilities to take control of an affected system.

Multiple Vulnerabilities in Google Could Allow for Arbitrary Code Execution

Multiple vulnerabilities have been discovered in Google Chrome, the most severe of which could allow for arbitrary code execution. Google Chrome is a web browser used to access the internet. Successful exploitation of the most severe of these vulnerabilities could allow for arbitrary code execution in the context of the logged on user. Depending on the privileges associated with the user an attacker could then install programs; view, change, or delete data; or create new accounts with full user rights. Users whose accounts are configured to have fewer user rights on the system could be less impacted than those who operate with administrative user rights. Juniper Networks Releases Security Updates for Multiple Products

Introduction to the National Cybersecurity Center of Excellence

As a part of the Department of Commerce's National Institute of Standards and Technology's (NIST) Applied Cybersecurity Division, the National Cybersecurity Center of Excellence (NCCoE) is a collaborative hub where industry, government, and academia work together to address businesses' most pressing cybersecurity challenges for specific industries as well as for broad, cross-sector technology areas.

What makes the NCCoE unique is the hands-on nature of its work and its close association with industry and the cybersecurity technology community. This public-private partnership enables the creation of a modular and adaptable example cybersecurity demonstrations which enable practitioners to apply standards and best practices using commercially available technologies.

National Online Informative References (OLIR) Program: Overview, Benefits, and Use

NIST is seeking public comments on two draft NIST Internal Reports (NIST IR) for the National Online Informative References (OLIR) Program. This Program is a NIST effort to facilitate subject matter experts in defining [Online Informative References \(OLIRs\)](#), which are standardized expressions of relationships between concepts in information and communication technology (ICT) documents, like the NIST Cybersecurity Framework.

The draft reports are revisions of existing publications that provide 1) an overview of the Program and its benefits and use (NIST IR 8278r1), and 2) submission guidance for OLIR developers (NIST IR 8278Ar1).

The increasingly common practice, known as Bring Your Own Device (BYOD), provides employees with increased flexibility to telework and access organizational information resources. Helping to ensure that an organization's data is protected when it is accessed from personal devices, while also protecting the privacy needs of employees, poses unique challenges and threats.

The goal of this practice guide is to provide an example solution that helps organizations use both a standards-based approach and commercially available

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technologies to help meet their security and privacy needs when permitting personally owned mobile devices to access enterprise resources.

NCCoE Releases Preliminary Draft Practice Guide for Trusted IoT Onboarding and Lifecycle Management

Provisioning network credentials to Internet of Things (IoT) devices in an untrusted manner leaves networks vulnerable to having unauthorized IoT devices connect to them. It also leaves IoT devices vulnerable to being taken over by unauthorized networks. Instead, trusted, scalable, and automatic mechanisms are needed to safely manage IoT devices throughout their lifecycles, beginning with secure ways to provision devices with their network credentials—a process known as trusted network-layer onboarding. Trusted network-layer onboarding, in combination with additional device security capabilities such as device attestation, application-layer onboarding, secure lifecycle management, and device intent enforcement could improve the security of networks and IoT devices.

This draft practice guide aims to demonstrate how organizations can protect both their IoT devices and their networks. NCCoE is collaborating with product and service providers to produce example implementations of trusted network-layer onboarding and capabilities that improve device and network security throughout the IoT-device lifecycle to achieve this.

Announcement of Proposal to Update FIPS 197, The Advanced Encryption Standard

As a part of the periodic review of NIST's cryptographic standards and guidelines, NIST's Crypto Publication Review Board (Review Board) announced the review of Federal Information Processing Standards Publication (FIPS) 197, The Advanced Encryption Standard (AES) in May 2021.

NIST proposes to update FIPS 197. An update of a publication is appropriate when it only requires changes to correct errors or clarify its interpretation, and no changes are made to technical content. Proposed changes to FIPS 197 are summarized in the [full announcement](#).

Evidence-Based Policies Reduce Flu-Related Illness and Death

Each year flu season in the United States cause millions of cases and thousands of corresponding flu-related hospitalizations and deaths. Most common during the fall and winter months, flu viruses tend to begin circulating in October and can persist until as late as May. However, it isn't possible to predict the exact timing and nature of flu activity. In recent years, the co-circulation of the COVID-19 virus and the introduction of subsequent protective measures such as masking have contributed to [dwindling flu case counts](#).

A recent [blog post](#) from the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials (ASTHO) discusses different public health strategies and trending legislative items to reduce flu-related illness and death and posits thoughts for the flu season ahead.

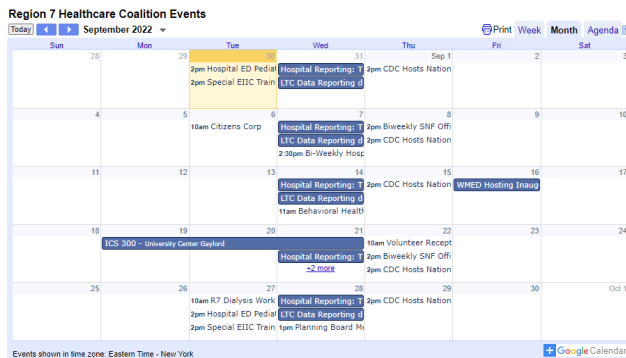
